Active Schools - Clubs

Term 2 is a busy one in the run up to Christmas, but Active Schools still has a number of sport and activity opportunities on offer for pupils of Alehousewells School.

Fun Fitness with David will be continuing this term on Wednesdays. We have a P4-7 session from 3:30pm-4:15pm, and a P1-3 session from 4:30pm-5:15pm. There are a number of spaces available in both groups so it would be great to see some new pupils join us this term for lots of running around, fun games, and team challenges.

New to the school this term is Skipping and Multi-Sports. Some of you may remember Vanessa who was part of the school health week back in the summer term, and we're very lucky that she is available to do some activity at Alehousewells this term. This club is open to any interested pupils in P1-7 with the sessions being on a Monday after school.

Improvement Plan

This session, we will be focusing on the following priorities for improvement:

1. Numeracy

Numicon materials. Ensure we have enough, as well as the manuals and workbooks. Staff training organised for November In service Day. Liaise with Nursery to rollout Numicon there. Set up packs for children to use at home. Organise Parents' information sessions on Numicon. Sumdog. In house training organised for In Service day in November. Desired effect is increased attainment in Numeracy.

2. Literacy.

Emerging Literacy. This has previously been used in P1 only so now looking to roll this approach out across P2-7. Develop foundational literacy skills, importance of adult/child interactions, support phonological awareness, use pre-teaching vocabulary to develop expressive language, review and purchase phonological Reading books for early readers. Desired effect is improved attainment in Literacy over time.

3. Health and Wellbeing

Staff training on October In service Day on use of new PE resources bought with Challenge 500 and Parent Council money last session. Resources bought also for outside use. Outdoor Learning arena installed and used. Nurture course attended by some staff. Approach then cascaded throughout school. Desired effect is vulnerable pupils are supported, school is a calmer, more nurturing environment with difficult behavior reduced.
