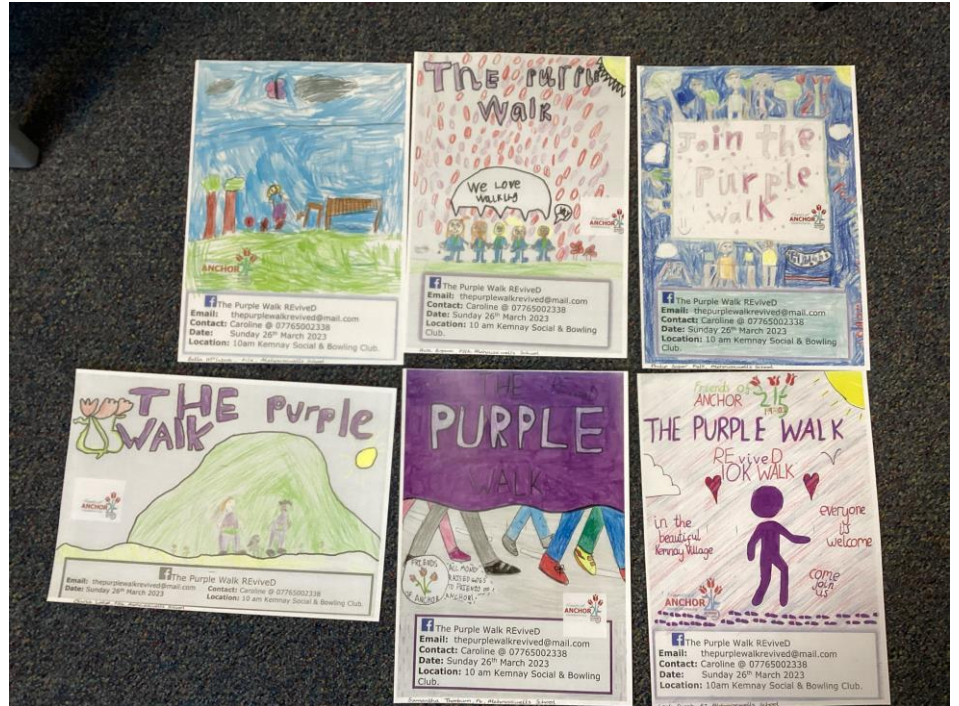

Christmas cards

With Christmas fast approaching, you may be beginning to think about Christmas cards. A few years ago, we started a new tradition for the giving and receiving of cards. As you know, we aspire to be an eco-friendly school and issues such as saving trees, reducing waste, recycling and caring for our planet are at the heart of what we do. The giving and receiving of a Christmas card is still considered to be part of our Christmas preparations. But here is something to think about:

In previous years, approximately 4000 cards were exchanged within our school each Christmas! In 2019, staff and pupils managed to reduce that total to well under 200 without losing the spirit of Christmas.

This year we have the potential to reduce that total even further and really put some thought into what we write and the wishes we send. If you wish, each child can bring one card to school for their class rather than individual cards. Staff will also not be distributing cards to each other either. Instead, we plan to donate the money we would have spent on a pack of cards to Friends of Anchor, our charity of the year. This idea will vastly reduce the money everyone needs to spend on cards and at the same time, help the environment.
